

About The Balsam Centre

I need to raise lots of money to build a workshop for the handicapped within Wincanton's Balsam Centre. Not just an ordinary workshop, but also one that uses clay as the main therapeutic and recreational material. A pottery designed so that disabled folk can use and benefit from the environment and material.

I was a potter for thirty years, a master potter in fact. I'm retired now, but during my time I worked with some very clever people who used hand crafts to help rehabilitate stroke and accident victims. The results were astonishing; I took one young man on a journey that started with a road traffic accident that left him brain damaged and finished two years later with hope for the future. He is coping, confident and living a full life. I know from Des Underwood of the Balsam Centre that there's no similar scheme in the area. But it takes money to build and run a unit like that and that's where the twinning comes in.

Buy yourself a fancy piece of stuff

The Cunning artificer has bowed to public pressure and reproduced the ancient coat of arms of the Wincanton Guild of Artificer's. Much secrecy surrounds the inner workings of the guild, but traditionally entered Apprentices were awarded the shield on completion of a verbal exam and the exchange of negotiable tokens. The Merchants Hall




Book signing


