Events:

Gangshow:

The Discworld Jamboree 2007; Scouting for Trolls is proud to present to you "The Greatest Show On Disc" The Gangshow 2007 Spectacular. The Knights of Honour are a 14th Century medieval re-enactment company who recreate the period in history commonly known as The Hundred Years War. From Edward III to Henry V (1337-1453), encompassing the great battles of Crécy, Poitiers and Agincourt.

Watch as the mighty knights in armour battle for glory and a chance to fight for King Edward III to protect their lands and borders, here in mighty England and in France. Soak in the history around an authentic medieval encampment, with demonstrations ranging from traditional cooking to arms and armour talks.

The Knights of Honour re-enactment brings history to life and allows you to experience the time of chivalry and honour!

Masquerade:

Stephen Briggs will be hosting the first Discworld Jamboree Masquerade between 4pm and 6pm on the Saturday. In a break from tradition, our Masquerade will be a little different and in two classes. There will be prizes.

Magic Show:

With no expense spent The Discworld Jamboree is delighted to present for your delectation and delight, magic and mystery from the Disc's foremost, award winning, wizard, Rob 'Lupine'. Escapologist extraordinaire, illusionist beyond compare, there's nothing this magician will not dare.

Signing:

South West Camerata:

The overwhelming success of the first Junior Chamber Music Performance Programme, created by Fiona McLean, at the Dartington International Summer School 2005, highlighted the need for a high quality, unconduted youth chamber orchestra, resulting in the formation of

the South West Camerata, which had its official launch in Plymouth University in January 2005.

The S.W. Camerata consists of string players only; students need to have achieved a minimum level of Grade 7, or equivalency in repertoire in order to be considered for membership for the ensemble.

Students are encouraged to feel an integral part of the development of South West Camerata and new compositions from them are particularly welcome. They are encouraged to offer when appropriate, concerti which they are studying, either for a play through at a rehearsal, or for a public performance. The lack of a conductor, allows students to develop their sense of communication skills and rapport, focusing awareness of each other in performance. They have made many public appearances since their inaugural concert in 2006 and we are delighted to play host to them.

There will be a timetable available in Reception to pre-book your session. This event is only available on Saturday.


There will be a height restriction but we could be flexible on this (we have some heavy weights)


The single best thing a cinderella stamp collector can do this year




For 40 years The Cinderella Stamp Club has quietly supported enthusiasts of all sorts of non-postage stamps - including Discworld stamps, fantasy stamps, revenues, railway stamps, exhibition and advertising stamps.

The club produces a 48-60 page quarterly magazine including a FREE cinderella stamp or minisheet gift and is packed with cinderella news and information, with illustrated features from writers such as Mark Valentine (who contributed to the Discworld Leshp/Rockall issue) and your very own Bernard Pearson. Find out about other cinderella producers around the world, exchange stamps with other collectors through the Club's Packet Scheme and use the Sales and Wants page of the magazine to track down hard-to-find cinderellas.


Leech Wrangling:

Map Reading Orienteering:
